How I found my 1966 Plymouth Hemi Satellite

Have you ever made a decision and you weren't sure you had made a smart move? My guess is most of us would say "Yes." Well that's the feeling I had when I became the owner of a 1966 Plymouth Hemi Satellite.

In 2013 I was surfing the Internet and came across this 1966 Plymouth on Ebay. There were only a few pictures and a poor description, but this car captured my

attention. I placed what I thought was a low bid, but the next thing you know I am the winner. My wife, Ruth, had further evidence of my insanity. I was very apprehensive about the purchase, but I kept telling Ruth I knew what I was doing and it would be okay. I had the car shipped from the seller in Tucson and when it arrived and I saw it and heard it start up, I could hardly believe it, my Satellite was in much better condition than I expected. It appeared to be basically preserved and seldom driven by the last few owners.

The History

The 426 hemi was first produced in 1964 for racing only. In 1965 I watched these cars race at the Missouri State Fair. In 1966 the Chrysler Corporation began offering a slightly detuned version as a \$907 option. This was a considerable amount of money as my car's base price was around \$2,650. My Satellite is one of only 503 produced with the hemi and a 4-speed transmission. These cars led fast and abused lives and very few original ones are left. The hemi is an iconic engine that has dominated racing for many years, yet it is seldom seen on the streets. I have seen only a

handful my entire life, but each time I did it left a lasting impression.

My car has been in a number of books. I keep finding pictures of it, all from around the 1990s, and the car still presents today as it appeared in these books.

After I won the Ebay auction the seller told me that he found some kind of badge in

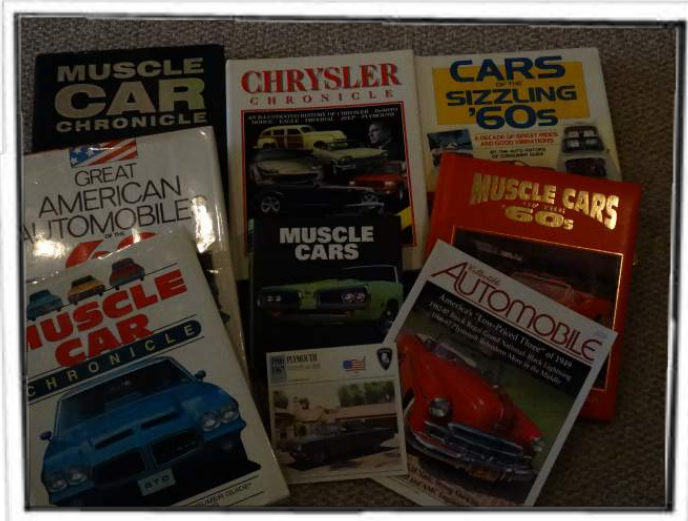

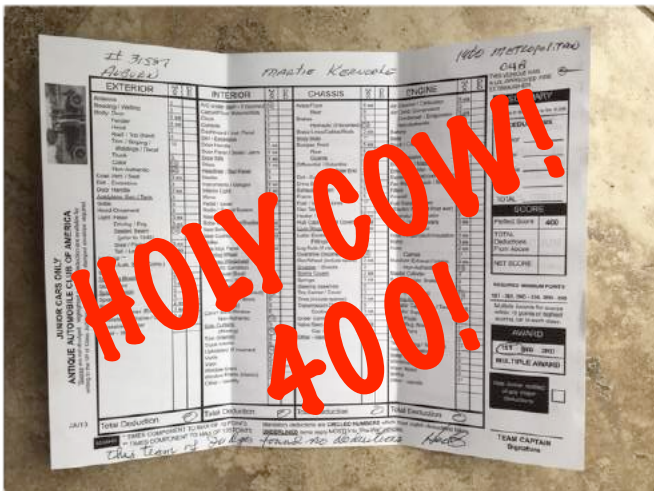
The Show

Don O'Reilly Collection Arrives at AACA Library & Research Center *Racing Enthusiasts Will Be Amazed By the Collection*

Holy Cow Batman! A trailer truck load of literature has arrived at the AACA Library & Research Center in Hershey, PA! Yes, the completely full, double and triple stacked 54' commercial trailer was full of literature, films and ephemera mostly about the world of racing. This is the collection amassed by the former publisher of *Speed Age*, Don O'Reilly. The collection was donated to the library by a very good friend and supporter of AACA.

Don O'Reilly was a prolific writer, photographer and historian, which led him through a career of many assignments with NASCAR and magazines. Don practically invented the genre of writing about auto racing beyond the Indy 500. He brought stock car racing and his love for local race tracks to mainstream publications and had a lot to do with starting NASCAR on its way to such great heights today. For those who wish to know more about him, there is a definitive piece written about him by Charles B. Camp in the November/December 2011 issue of *Vintage Motorsports*.

Voluminous photographs, home videos and other resources are being uncovered by the AACA Library staff. Every day is going to be a treasure hunt going through the 500+ boxes that arrived recently.

The Don O'Reilly Collection will be properly archived, digitized where appropriate and catalogued for future historians and fans to use. The AACA Library & Research Center is a 501 (C) (3) organization and is a free public library. With over 1,250,000 items in its holdings, three librarians with their master degrees and a purpose-built facility, the library is a great resource for the collector car hobby.

Ken Lee gave a presentation on “Ethanol”.

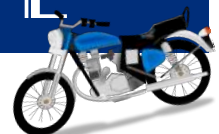

Readin' Writin' and Wrenchin'

"This & That"

- A cars age if properly maintained...has nothing to do with reliability.
- A state inspection does not mean your car is reliable and won't leave you stranded.
- When was the last time you checked the tire pressure on your spare?
- If your temp gauge is reading inaccurate or not at all, remove your temp sender in engine, clean threads, never use pipe tape or sealant on threads. The sender must be grounded.
- When was the last time you lubed front wheel bearings and torqued. (Use special wheel bearing grease).
- On a cold start, if your classic backfires, stumbles and runs poorly until warmed up...something big time is wrong. There is no such thing as "cold natured" if mechanically everything is correct.
- If you have steering vibration and play, inspect the fiber rubber coupler of steering shaft. Through age, heat and oil contamination can split this coupler. If it splits no steering. If old and original I would replace it.
- In night driving, do you get other drivers giving you a high beam check? Your headlights could be out of adjustment. Age, tire size, suspension height, or a past collision will have an effect on your headlights.
- What does the adjusting screw on your horns do? This adjustment is designed to set current draw. Through time and corrosion it changes. Should be set 7 to 11 amps.

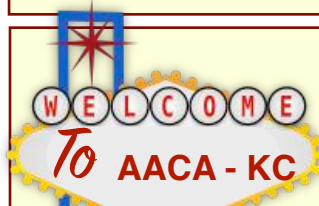

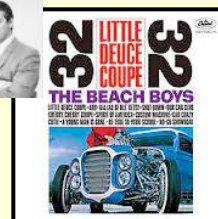
