





History Repeats Itself (Part 1)

It was the fall of 1916 when two Maxwell Motor Corporation salesmen had an idea. They felt any car that could cross the United States in the winter months would make an excellent every day family car. They sold this idea to Texaco and Firestone and on November 16, 1916, C.W. Tuthill and P.G. Scull left Newwark, New Jersey, for California.



C.W. Tuthill kept a diary of the trip as they drove along the Lincoln Highway

and The Old Trail Road through 36 towns and 12 states. They used ferries to cross rivers, slept in the car multiple nights and repaired tires many times. At night, they drained the water out of the radiator so it would not freeze. At times, they had to wait on gas deliveries (gas stations were not on every corner then). They arrived in Los Angeles, California, in 10 days and 16 hours. They used 188 gallons of gas and 7 gallons of oil. After a few days in California they returned to Newark, New Jersey, using a different southernly route to complete the round trip.




C.W. Tuthill was my grandfather and this November my brother and I intend to celebrate our grandfather's accomplishment by repeating this trip again in a 1917 Maxwell. Using his diary, we have an accurate list of the towns they passed through, places they ate, slept and got gas and oil. Using this




information, we have been able to pick out a route to recreate this accomplishment.

We have a 1917 Maxwell that is being prepared for the trip. It has been repainted and we are adding the same signage to the car, so it looks just like our grandfather's car. Our plan is to leave

Newark, New Jersey, on November 16, 2016, 100 years after our grandfather made his start. We hope to complete the trip in 10 days and then will trailer the Maxwell back to the east coast.

We have created a website that includes our



grandfather's diary as well as pictures, letters and postcards he sent along the way. We have also included information about the Maxwell we are preparing for the trip. Interested readers can find all of this information <u>here</u>.

Part 2 of this story will come after the repetition of history is completed.



Readin' Writin' and Wrenchin'

Is Hot a "bad thing" ???

In the past, I've covered cooling problems on our classics. This writing covers accessories and automatic transmission. When under-hood temperatures rise, hoses and other sub-assemblies are affected and longevity is compromised. Power steering generates a great deal of temperature. Some manufacturers of the 60's had a separate power

The automatic transmission temperature is in direct relation with it's life. It has a cooler, but not separate. Lines from the transmission are passed through the engine radiator and then returned to transmission. So, when your engine is running hotter than it should, the transmission is also affected. According to (ATRA) Automatic Transmission Rebuilders Association...90% of failures are from over heating. In overheating oxidation occurs. When high temp or overheating occurs, this causes a breakdown in the additives of the transmission fluid. When this occurs sludge, varnish, and acids develop. This internally affects the blockage of ports that feed bearing, clutches, and gears. This also causes poor lubrication. Transmission slippage can also occur and may not be detectable. This slippage can cause a significant loss of gas mileage (10-15%). When this occurs you get to spend money on a transmission rebuild.

Some newer vehicles are equipped with a transmission gauge (good idea). How many times have you seen an RV or heavy-loaded vehicle being pulled to the side of the road with transmission issues? Summer heat, air-conditioning, and a long trip all contribute to ultra-high transmission temperature. A separate transmission cooler is very good prevention. This also helps the engine because the b.t.u. transfer that comes from the transmission tubes into the radiator will be eliminated. Servicing the transmission by replacing the fluid and filter per owners manual suggestion is a must. Use the lube services that have your engine running. All old fluid is removed the same time the new is being pumped in. By dropping the trans pan...you only remove about half of the transmission oil. The torque converter holds 4-6 quarts. Like engine oil synthetics, trans-synthetics are a plus. This will allow less friction which leads to less heat.

So, before your next trip make sure your trans fluid is fresh, with a good filter, and a proper oil level.

A long time after this, Shiloh was having a particularly stressful day. He ran away from the other students, and a teacher found him sitting up against the garage where he and Mark had restored the Model T."He had to go back to that experience, to that spot where he felt encouragement," Mark explained. "The car is something he has taken pride in; he will always go back to it throughout life. Now cars are an important thing in his life."

Mark and Shiloh completely dismantled the Model T, took the

wheels off, and had it professionally painted in a shop. They restored it in an unheated garage that's older than the car. The garage is so old, it has a wooden floor.

Thanks to a Collectors Foundation grant of \$7,500 in 2006, Mark - who started the program with his own funds - was able to stop using his own money and purchase tools, equipment and auto parts."It's inspiring to know that the Collectors Foundation is looking to restore cars and to get kids interested in it," Mark said."The financial support from the Collectors Foundation has been wonderful."

Beyond purchasing vital equipment, the Collectors Foundation support has paved the way for others to support the



program. "Because of Collectors Foundation support, others see it. People want to get on a moving train," Mark explained. A local automotive retailer donated a custom-made 15-foot trailer for the car. Car clubs are matching the Collectors Foundation grant, car guys want to mentor students in the program, and one car guy has even stated his interest in being a fulltime teacher.

Mark is gearing up to launch a fundraising campaign for a larger, heated building. In the meantime, he's looking for the next Model T for the program. Mark said they can't have a car lift for insurance reasons, but Model T's "sit so tall,
